*Memorial garden accents you may wish to consider:*

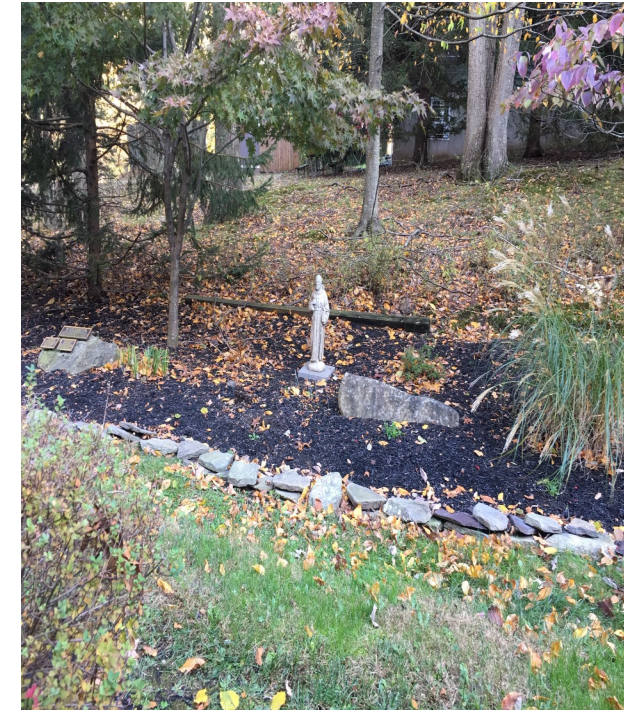
*Wind Chimes, Wind Spinners
